ESAU - SOME PRINCIPLES

- WHAT YOU SEE IS WHAT YOU GET UNLESS YOU SEE MORE THAN ONE MATERIAL.
- IF THE MATERIAL IS NOT VISIBLE, IT PROBABLY CAN BE IGNORED.
- OVERLAYS ARE PROBLEMATIC AND DEPENDING ON A NUMBER OF FACTORS MAY BE INCLUDED IN ESAU
- 4. IS THE OVERLAY LASTED? IS IT ATTACHED TO A PIECE WHICH IS LASTED?
- 5. IS THE OVERLAY JOINED AT ITS EDGE TO A LASTED COMPONENT?
- 6. DOES THE OVERLAY FLOAT?
- FOXING-LIKE BANDS AND SIDEWALLS ARE IGNORED UNLESS THEY DO NOT COVER VIABLE UPPER MATERIAL.
- 8. IN MEASURING COMPONENTS, YOU INCLUDE ONLY THE VISIBLE PORTION.
- TONGUES AND LOOSELY-ATTACHED APPURTENANCES ARE INGNORED.
- 10. WHAT HAPPENS WHEN A LASTED PIECE IS PURELY DECORATIVE OR IS NOT VIABLE UPPER MATERIAL?
