The Trump Administration has *officially* extended the reciprocal tariff deadline via executive order, this time to August 1st.

- The action covers all countries impacted by the threat of reciprocal tariffs set to take effect July 9th before today's order.

Executive Order for 8/1

Oh, also: The president ended up sending letters to 14 countries announcing new tariff rates that will soon hit if no deal is reached.

The new tariff rates: The president shared the letters outlining the new rates to the following countries on Truth Social:

- Japan (25%), Korea (25%), South Africa (30%), Kazakhstan (25%), Laos (40%), Malaysia (25%), Myanmar (40%), Tunisia (25%), Bosnia and Herzegovina (30%), Indonesia (32%), Bangladesh (35%), Serbia (35%), Cambodia (36%), and Thailand (36%).
- Effective date: The new duty rates will take effect on August 1st. This gives the countries a few more weeks to continue to negotiate with the U.S. for a better deal.

Our thought bubble: We believe that the announcement targeting these 14 countries is likely intended to maximize American negotiating leverage for an agreement prior to the new self-imposed August 1st deadline.
